

## Christian Writing: Handling Writer's Block

*Understanding the causes, prevention (if possible) and practical way out of writers block experience*

- 1) A writer's block is an experience characterized by an inability to write as you can/should normally do, because the words are not just coming. *Ecclesiastes 10<sup>10</sup>*

✓ *Have you experienced this before?*

✓ *What was your reaction?*

- 2) Underutilization of one's gift can make its use difficult or impossible as gifts are fanned by usage. *Proverbs 24<sup>33,34</sup> Ecclesiastes 11<sup>4</sup>*

- a. Laziness i.e. being passive with your writing gift can lead to underutilization.

✓ *Do you think you are a passive or active writer?*

✓ *What is the basis for your answer?*

- b. Procrastinating, putting off, delaying or deferring writing to a later time can also lead to underutilization.

✓ *What reasons do you often give for deferring writing?*

3) Overutilization of one's gift can lead to its exploitation to the point of diminishing returns.

a. Sometimes writing too often or too extensively can lead to overutilization.

✓ What writing frequency works for you?

✓ What is your average writing length?

b. Improper use of the writing gift can also lead to overutilization.

✓ How can one put writing into improper use?

4) Staleness, lack of vitality, energy and originality can hamper Christian writing. *Matthew 11<sup>25-27</sup> John 15<sup>13-15</sup>*

a. You have more revelations when you are childlike.
